This editorial presents the articles from the first edition of the twelfth volume of the Brazilian Journal of Planning and Development (RBDP). In this issue, as in the previous ones, the works brought contributions on planning and development, as is usual in this journal.

In this edition, the opening article analyzes the administrative and legal implications of rural financing along the Brazilian border. Next, the diagnosis on the rate for handling urban solid waste in the municipalities of Rio de Janeiro is presented. The identification and analysis of the paths and strategies adopted by peasant workers to carry out the agroecological transition in family farming is in the third article. The fourth article deals with the analysis of the strategies adopted during the pandemic period by the municipal secretary of health of Curitiba and the lessons of the health crisis to identify responses to the emergency in public health.

The territorial transformations resulting from the implementation of the Circuito Vale Histórico Catarinense de Cicloturismo are presented in the fifth article. The sixth article is entitled: "Structuring local indicators for the disaster resilience Scorecard: advances for the making Resilient Cities Campaign in Brazil". The investigation of the limiting and favorable factors for the use of the extrajudicial adverse possession instrument in Brazilian urban land tenure regularization is dealt with in the seventh article.

The next two articles are about urban mobility. The first presents the correlations between the use of sidewalks with their physical condition, thermal comfort, dynamics on the ground floors and visual permeability between everyday public-private spaces in a city in the northeast region - Brazil, and the second identifies the economic, social and environmental impact that a paving change (from clay to polyhedral paving) provided in the community of Barra Bonita, rural area of Prudentópolis - PR, according to the principles of Sustainable Development – more precisely, objectives 8, 9 and 11 of the UN Agenda 2030 .

The tenth article presents the evaluation of the Reverse Logistics of unserviceable tires in the city of Guanambi - BA. The penultimate article brings the results of the Evaluation of the Level of Modernization in Family Agricultural Units in the semi-arid region of the state of Ceará. Finally, we have the identification of risk agents, through the Preliminary Risk Analysis (APR), in the activities carried out by workers at the Ver-o-Peso complex, Belém/PA.

This edition brings important reflections on the themes of urban mobility, regional development, resilient cities, urban planning, pandemic, land regularization, among others.

We take the opportunity to thank all the authors and reviewers of our journal for their contribution.
